Local Montessori School Receives Award From Ruth Cadbury MP

The Hounslow-based de Lacey Montessori School today announced that its two sites have received national recognition for going above and beyond the minimum requirements in paediatric first aid. With its robust processes and documentation, the nursery staff strive to keep children safe by minimising risks and accidents and giving parents that greater reassurance. It is the first nursery organisation in Hounslow Borough to achieve the prestigious 'Millie's Mark' from the National Day Nurseries Association. The award will be presented on February 23rd by Ruth Cadbury MP, Member of Parliament for Brentford & Isleworth, at the school, which is located in St Francis Community Hall, 865 Great West Road, Isleworth, TW7 5PD. Press invitations are available from Charlotte de Lacey, 07921 483391. The two schools, located in Isleworth and Norwood Green, have been awarded Millie's Mark by National Day Nurseries Association in collaboration with the Department for Education and Millie's Trust. Millie's Mark is named after Millie Thompson, who tragically died as a

result of choking in a nursery in 2012. Her parents Dan and Joanne Thompson have campaigned for all nursery staff to have paediatric first aid training and having Millie's Mark demonstrates that nurseries have met this and more. In addition it shows they work hard to keep these crucial skills in the forefront of employees' minds, so they are competent and can apply paediatric first aid in any situation. Owner Charlotte de Lacey comments: "We are absolutely thrilled to have been awarded Millie's Mark. This is a special achievement and shows how serious we are about ensuring children are safe when they are in our care. I would like to thank everyone who has supported us during this process and we are all very much looking forward to celebrating our success." I also wanted to let you know why we wanted to work towards this award. In 2016 a little girl called Shanaz Ali started at the nursery. Her mum told us that she and her twin brother had both been born at 26 weeks and had been in hospital for months before they were finally allowed home. Shanaz has three

holes in her heart, weak lungs and multiple hospitalisations under her belt already at the tender age of just two years old. Her parents had already had to resuscitate her twice by the time she started nursery, and the possibility that her heart might stop while she was with us was very real. Obviously we wanted to be fully prepared, organised, and able to handle any major medical emergency that Shanaz (or any other child) might present us with, and Millie's Mark seemed the obvious choice to get us to that point. We have worked hard, as a whole staff team, across both nurseries, to achieve this award. Of course we hope never to need to use them, but we now have comprehensive emergency response procedures that means that not only will Shanaz (or any other child) get the emergency first aid that they need, but that help will be summoned, with all the information that they need, other children in our care will be shielded, in an organised, calm manner, immediately. Shanaz is now three and getting stronger, though



still has serious health needs, she was recently hospitalised with bronchitis and pneumonia and was extremely unwell. (Shanaz's story is shared with permission from her parents). Purnima Tanuku, Chief Executive of National Day Nurseries Association (NDNA) adds: "Achieving Millie's Mark is a great achievement for the nursery, it shows that all staff are fully trained in paediatric

first aid and that they have reflected on their current practice to improve competence and confidence. Becoming a Millie's Mark's nursery is a clear indicator for parents that this nursery has met the highest standards and gives them the reassurance that their children are safe'. Having the Millie's Mark award demonstrates your commitment to going above and beyond the minimum re-

quirements for keeping children safe. It shows that all staff working directly with children not only hold a paediatric first aid certificate but that they are also competent in how to apply this in practice. REDESIGNCS9 RAISE CONCERN OVER TFL CONSULTATION

RedesignCS9, a self-funded group of local traders and residents who live and work in Hammersmith and Chiswick, released a statement in response to Transport For London's consultation report on CS9. The group does not believe that the current design of Cycle Superhighway 9 is in the best interest of residents and businesses. TFL said they received 5,388 responses to the consultation, of which 59 per cent supported or strongly supported its proposals. 39 per cent did not support them, while two per cent said they neither supported nor opposed the proposals. REDESIGNCS9 - Statement in response to TFL Consultation report: "The residents and traders of Hammersmith and Chiswick have been portrayed by cyclists as being anti-cycling and NIMBYs. This is misinformation. We are not. "Hammersmith and Chiswick would benefit from improved cycling infrastructure, but that should mean working

with residents and businesses locally to find a scheme that works for everyone. "Many traders and residents were not consulted by TfL or the London Borough of Hounslow. Many of us did not receive letters, leaflets or emails and were unaware of TfL's consultation. That is why so many of us signed the various

petitions objecting to CS9 in its current form. "It is evident that this consultation has been influenced by cyclists and people who do not live in the areas concerned. Many of these people have openly stated on social forums that they have no regard for the interests or needs of local people, businesses,

pedestrians or public transport users. "To rectify TfL's lack of consultation with us, we call upon them and the Mayor of London to meet with residents and traders as a matter of urgency to find a better solution that works for everyone in our community - and not just for a small minority."

NEW WATERSIDE COMMUNITY FOR BRENTFORD

Plans to redevelop land between the southern side of Brentford High Street and the River Brent moved forward in February with a groundbreaking event at the Ballymore site off Brent Way. The event coincided with an announcement later that same day by the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, confirming a Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) for the planned regeneration of the area which will see Ballymore bring almost 900 homes, more than 25,000sqm of commercial space as well as a public square, new connections from the High Street to the waterside - something which will reinstate historic yards - an extension of the Thames Path across the site along the waterfront, and improved waterside infrastructure with permanent mooring spaces. Hounslow Council Leader, Cllr Steve Curran, Cabinet Member for Housing, Cllr Katherine Dune, Cabinet Member for Finance and Citizen Engagement, Cllr Theo Dennison, and Brentford

ward councillors Mel Collins and Guy Lambert were all in attendance on the day. They were joined by Ballymore's Managing Director, John Mulryan, and the company's development manager for the scheme, Ed Heppenstall. Together, they formally marked the commencement of demolition works within the first phase, in which a third of all of the scheme's new homes will be located, as well as more than 7,000 sq m of commercial space and extensive public realm. Speaking on the day, Cllr Steve Curran said: "Regenerating the High Street and restoring access to the waterside will contribute positively to the identity of Brentford, enhancing civic pride and cultural opportunities.

"The scheme will also give a boost to local employment opportunities, with some 950 new jobs as a result of the scheme. This long-anticipated redevelopment will create a high quality and vibrant area within the heart of the town centre, creating an attractive place to live, shop, work, and for leisure." Ballymore Managing Director, John Mulryan, added: "We are delighted to have made progress and commenced these works at Brentford Waterside; we know that there has been much anticipation locally around the scheme. "We are passionate about creating an exciting, contemporary district and I am delighted that, with demolition underway, we can turn our vision into a reality for the people of Brentford."

Ealing Borough Of Culture Bid UnCOVERS Ideas

Ealing's bidding process for London Borough of Culture has uncovered new partnerships between many local organisations. Although Ealing did not win, there's a lot of exciting ideas to build on. The organisations include Ealing Youth Orchestra & Ealing Music Service; Gunnersbury Museum & The Ealing Club; Ealing Library Service & Penguin Random House are keen to develop their proposals further and make these exciting events /activities happen. The council will continue to raise awareness of the cultural offer in Ealing and through the Ealing Arts & Culture Forum engage with the arts sector and funding agencies. In 2018, Gunnersbury Park will be home to the popular Lovebox and Citadel festivals which will maintain Ealing's amazing track record for festivals and outdoor events. Pitzhanger Manor and Gallery will open under new management and Gunnersbury Park Museum will re-open to the public. Both have undergone significant restoration and will be important cultural attractions for the enjoyment of



visitors. Ealing has diversity and rich culture which has allowed the borough to thrive over several years and this will continue to happen in the future. Residents can be assured the council will be putting a great deal of working into developing arts and culture through some amazing partnerships and funding possibilities. Councillor Julian Bell, leader of Ealing Council said: "Ealing should be very proud of its arts and culture and despite not being successful this

Breast Cancer Workforce Shortages In Greater London

Shortages in the breast cancer workforce in Greater London have reached a critical level with more than a quarter of mammography posts vacant, according to a new report by the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Breast Cancer (APGBC) – and supported by leading charity Breast Cancer Now.

The landmark report, 'A Mixed Picture: An Inquiry into Geographical Inequalities and Breast Cancer', uncovers the true extent of the 'post-code lottery' in breast cancer diagnosis, treatment and care across England, with women

in worst-affected areas found to be more than twice as likely to die from breast cancer under the age of 75 than those elsewhere in the country. Following a year-long inquiry (October 2016 - November 2017), which gathered evidence from NHS leaders, clinicians, patients and charities, the report found that while overall outcomes for breast cancer are improving, stark geographical inequalities exist across England in screening, early detection and access to treatment and services. With the report's publication,

leading MPs have today called for NHS England and Public Health England to intervene to address the geographical variation in breast cancer services across England. The inquiry heard serious concerns from NHS leaders about the "demographic time bomb" facing the breast cancer workforce. Current vacancy rates, coupled with a mammographic workforce approaching retirement, are affecting the health service's ability to cope with increasing breast cancer incidence among an ageing population. Worryingly, more than a

quarter (25.74%) of mammography posts were unfilled in Greater London. These shortages can have a severe impact on the speed at which patients are diagnosed and therefore treated. But despite staffing pressures, 94.7% of Greater London patients were seen by a specialist within the recommended two weeks, compared to just 84.5% in the South West and 88.1% in the East Midlands. The report revealed that Greater London had the lowest breast screening attendance rates in England in 2016-17, with just 64% of women invited to screening attending within six months – falling short of the national target of 70%. However, despite the worryingly low uptake levels, London was the only region to see an increase (6.1%) in attendance over the last ten years, bucking the nationwide trend. In 2005/6 Tower Hamlets had one of the lowest uptake rates and poorest survival outcomes in the country, but following several local innovations, the CCG saw a 13.6% increase in screening attendance in just three years. The APPG on Breast Cancer is now calling on other regions to

learn from and adopt similar interventions – such as offering a second specific appointment time for those who don't take up their first invitation, text message reminders and pre-appointment phone calls – to those that proved effective in increasing uptake in Tower Hamlets. Women between the ages of 50 and 70 are invited for routine mammograms every three years as part of the NHS Breast Screening Programme. A major independent review in 2012 showed that NHS breast screening prevents 1,300 deaths from breast cancer each year, with around a third of all breast cancers in the UK – roughly 16,000 cases a year – diagnosed through the Programme. Following the report's publication, the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Breast Cancer is now calling on NHS England and Public Health England to urgently address the stark geographical variation in breast cancer services by:

- improving the consistency, transparency and accountability of breast cancer services through new NHS structures (called Cancer Alliances)
- addressing the "demographic time bomb" in the breast cancer workforce, ensuring clear plans are published to address critical shortages in both diagnostics and nursing - ensuring data is finally collected effectively across the country to drive service improvements, to support the development of tailored local prevention, awareness and screening initiatives

Thangam Debonnaire MP, Craig Tracey MP and Dr Philippa Whitford MP, co-chairs of the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Breast Cancer, said: "Our report uncovers widespread differences in the diagnosis, treatment and care of women with breast cancer, depending on where they live. It's encouraging that more Londoners are attending screening than a decade ago, but the capital is still failing to meet the national targets. This, coupled with the demographic time bomb facing the diagnostic and imaging workforce, is incredibly alarming and must be urgently addressed. More women are developing breast cancer than ever before and we need to ensure local NHS services are fully resourced to meet this demand."

Hounslow Council Launches Online Applications For Discretionary Housing Payment

An easy-to-use online application process for Discretionary Housing Payments (DHP) has been launched by Hounslow Council. Following the successful introduction of a new online system for residents to manage their council tax and benefit accounts online, with almost all new claims now made online, the council is introducing online applications for Discretionary Housing Payments. A Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP) is an extra payment to help people who claim housing benefit and are struggling to pay the rent. The DHP is not a payment of housing benefit or council tax support. It is a separate payment made at the council's discretion in cases where it considers that extra help with housing costs are needed. Councillor Katherine Dunne, Cabinet Member for Housing, Hounslow Council, said: "The new online form is easier and much quicker to complete, as residents only need



to answer the questions relevant to their circumstances. "For those residents, still unsure about applying online, we have help and support available to make sure they can access and use the service fully, so I encourage them to make use of that." Who can claim for a DHP? You can only receive a DHP towards your rent if you're receiving housing benefit. Residents will need to demonstrate that extra help is needed with housing costs. The council will look at individual circumstances to see whether or not a person is eligible for a DHP and how much will be paid and for how long. The amount and

length of award will be dependent on circumstances and the amount of money the council has available, but this would not exceed more than 52 weeks. A DHP cannot be used:

- to cover periods where Housing Benefits or Universal Credit [rent element] is not in payment
- to pay ineligible service charges
- to minimise the effect of Job Seeker Plus sanctions
- to make a payment when housing benefit is suspended
- to help with council tax

HOUNSLOW COUNCIL WELCOMES ADDITIONAL POLICE FUNDING FROM THE MAYOR OF LONDON

In his Budget for 2018-19 the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, has committed to investing an additional £110million into the Metropolitan Police. The additional funding will be used to help combat knife crime; deliver a two per cent police pay increase; boost of officer numbers; improve support for those taken in by the police with mental health problems; as well as providing investment in police buildings and technology. The Council recently reaffirmed its commitment to keeping residents safe by announcing an investment of £1,149,000 to fund one Police Sergeant and nine Constables for three years, to help deliver the Council's priorities. Councillor Hanif Khan, Cabinet Member for Community Protection and Enforcement, Hounslow Council said: "In recent years, the Met Police have had to find £600m of savings, so the Mayor's commitment to increase funding over the next year is very welcome indeed.



In the past we've fully supported the Mayor's efforts to combat knife crime in the capital so we are pleased to hear that this is one of the areas to receive additional funding. It is important that we empower our young people to make the right choices and we provide support to those who are at

risk of becoming involved in crime. Our police in Hounslow continue to provide valued support to the Council and have proven their effectiveness time and time again in keeping residents safe across the borough."

MORE FUNDING NEEDED FOR CEMETERIES, SAYS CHISWICK COUNCILLOR

Chiswick Conservative Councillor Gerald McGregor, visited Chiswick New Cemetery this week after various complaints regarding the poor care and consideration given to the deceased. Specifically, complaints relate to poor ground maintenance and damage done to grave-stones and flower pots because of grass cutting. Upon visiting the cemetery, Chiswick Champion Councillor McGregor said, "I was appalled to see the treatment and lack of care given to our deceased and highly concerned over the lack of funding, resulting in the deterioration of our borough's cemeteries. The £200,000 pledged recently by this Labour Council is simply inadequate to address the worsening problems". Alongside officers from Hounslow Council, Councillor McGregor was also shown dilapidated buildings on site as well as memorial park




Entrance to Chiswick Cemetery (Photo: Google Earth)

benches that have been neglected. There were also uneven surfaces around grave-stones, making access difficult for mourners to walk on lawn sections and visit loved ones. "It is clear we need more staff on site but more importantly, we as a Council, need to promote and support more friends groups and volunteers, whom give time and effort in maintaining and looking after the interests of our cemeteries. Over time, their voices have not been heard and their

influence declining." He continued, "I hope my visit here today will further highlight and put pressure on our Parks and Cemeteries Team, especially the Labour Lead Member Councillor Samia Chaudhary, to further increase funding ahead of the new cemetery strategy. I am determined that those buried throughout the Borough, get the proper respect and dignity they deserve in their final resting place".

ACTION TAKEN TO STOP ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR AT ISLEWORTH HOTEL BAR

Strict licence conditions have been imposed on Terminal 6 Lounge & Bar at the Osterley Park Hotel in Isleworth after the Council received complaints about alleged noise nuisance and anti-social behaviour.

The conditions imposed include CCTV, staff training, an anti-drugs policy and the requirement for Security Industry Authority (SIA) Door Supervisors on Friday and Saturday evenings. The hotel is also now required to operate a dispersal policy, with all staff being trained on its implementation, and levels of noise are to be actively controlled.

Following complaints from residents, the Council's Out of Hours Noise Team and Licensing Officer and Police Licensing Officer visited the premises and observed several alleged breaches of licence conditions including the premises going beyond their permitted hours of opening. The hotel's licence was then formally reviewed by a Panel of trained Licensing Councilors on Tuesday 6 February.

The Panel heard that local residents had suffered considerably from anti-social behaviour and noise on a regular basis, particularly into the early hours of Saturday and Sunday mornings.

The police proposed the conditions and the Panel implemented them. The Panel is satisfied that these conditions will ensure the protection of the licensing objectives and address residents' concerns. The Panel felt that a reduction in the hours of permitted operation at the premises would not be appropriate under the circumstances.

There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court by any party aggrieved by the Panel's decision.

Councillor Hanif Khan, Cabinet Member for Community Protection and Enforcement, Hounslow Council said:

"We are pleased that the Panel has taken such decisive action in dealing with the issues raised in relation to Terminal 6 Lounge & Bar at Osterley Park Hotel. The actions taken send a clear message to residents that we will act immediately and shows businesses that we will not allow breaches to licensing conditions to blight the lives of Hounslow residents. The new measures for the owners of the Osterley Park Hotel are now in place and we, along with the police, will be monitoring the situation to ensure these conditions are being met."



Chief Inspector Wayne Matthews, Neighbourhood Policing Lead, Hounslow Police, said: "Due to complaints received regarding the conduct of patrons who frequent the Osterley Park Hotel, a review of the licence was undertaken and conditions have been placed which should resolve the issues. Licencing officers from Hounslow Police were involved in this process and are supportive of the conditions. Anti-social behaviour blights areas and has a serious impact upon the life of the local residents. It is imperative that any licensed premises which could be seen to be contributing to such issues introduce measures which will prevent such behaviour. Hounslow Police will continue to work with the local authority and also the licensee of the premises in their efforts to stop anti-social behaviour and to protect the people of Hounslow."

'Expansion Is Now More Important Than Ever', Says Heathrow Airport

Heathrow Airport says new data reveals that some of Britain's most important trading routes from Heathrow are virtually full and that Britain's exporters risk being held back by limited cargo space on key routes to China, Japan, India, the US and the UAE.

"To secure Britain's global trading future post-Brexit, expanding Heathrow is now more important than ever", says the Airport.

Heathrow says Britain's exporters risk being held back by a lack of access to key trading markets. As Britain prepares to leave the EU, the data shows that key routes from Heathrow to Shanghai, Delhi, Mumbai, Los Angeles, Tokyo Haneda and Dubai are virtually full and unable to accommodate further growth in trade. Combined, these six routes alone account for nearly 18% of Heathrow's total cargo volumes.

Heathrow is already the UK's largest port by value – bigger than Felixstowe and Southampton combined – and



handled over £106bn worth of goods last year. Access to global markets through Heathrow is important for high-value goods and SME exporters, and 33% of the UK's non-EU exports already going through Heathrow.

Emma Gilthorpe, Heathrow's Executive Director Expansion, said "Expanding Heathrow couldn't be more important for Britain's future, as we're already seeing some of our most critical trading routes reach capacity.

If we want Britain to thrive as a global trading powerhouse after Brexit, we need to get on with expanding Heathrow now.

That starts with the Government taking advantage of the consensus in Parliament and scheduling a vote in Parliament before the summer.

"With new capacity at our nation's global gateway, we will unlock the trading opportunities that will underpin a prosperous future for all of Britain in the decades to come."

Back Heathrow Event Sees Labour MPs Call On Government For Heathrow Vote

Thirty Labour MPs demonstrated support for a new Heathrow runway at a pro-Heathrow expansion reception in Parliament last night.

At the event, executive director of Back Heathrow Parmjit Dhanda said: "This event shows that we effectively already have a majority in Parliament for expansion at

Heathrow and the green light for 180,000 new jobs.

"We are confident that over 150 Labour MPs would join forces with the Government to push through this crucial infrastructure decision. Mrs May needs to get on with it."

The Government has pledged that there will be a vote on Heathrow expansion in the

House of Commons before the summer recess.

Former Transport Minister John Spellar MP attended the reception and said: "This event showed the enormous level of support amongst trade union-backed Labour MPs for Heathrow expansion."

Starbucks Chiswick Launch 5p Paper Cup Charge Scheme

Starbucks has launched a 5p paper cup charge trial in 35 stores across London including its three sites in Chiswick, to evaluate whether customers will reduce their use of single-use paper cups.

The proceeds from the 5p charge will be donated to environmental charity and behaviour change experts, Hubbub.

The firms three locations in Chiswick, 270 and 376 Chiswick High Road, 270 and the site at Chiswick Park (Building 5), will be taking part in the trial.

Hubbub will help to track the impact of this three-month trial cup charge on customer behaviour, helping to reduce waste and encourage the use of reusable cups.

Hubbub will also use the funds to support other innovative campaigns to reduce waste across the capital.

Starbucks commissioned research found that almost half (48%) of people surveyed said they would carry a reusable cup, saving money and reducing waste. Since 2014,

Starbucks has offered a £1 reusable cup to make it as easy as possible for customers to reuse at an accessible price.

The trial, which will add 5p automatically on to any paper cup purchase in these 35 stores, will coincide with impactful in-store marketing communications to inform customers of the charge. To further reduce waste, Starbucks baristas will also ensure all customers drinking in store are offered their drink in a ceramic cup.

Simon Redfern, vp communications, Starbucks Europe said "We're hoping that this charge will remind customers to rethink their use of single-use plastic-lined cups, as it has with plastic bags.

We've offered a reusable cup discount for 20 years, with only 1.8% of customers currently taking up this offer, so we're really interested in working with Hubbub to see how this charge could help to change behaviour and help to reduce waste."

Gavin Ellis, Co-Founder, Hubbub said: "Our early conversations with customers have

shown an increased awareness of the need to reduce waste from single-use cups. Previous studies have shown that adding a charge on single-use cups is more effective than money off a reusable cup.

We're excited to be working on this initiative with Starbucks to find out if this is the case on the high street and to discover what else will encourage people to use reusable cups."

The 5p paper cup charge trial is the latest in Starbucks long-standing commitment to environmental action and sustainability.

In addition to its ongoing efforts to reduce material waste – such as a 25p discount for customers who bring in a reusable mug or tumbler – Starbucks is a founding member of the Sustainable Coffee Challenge, a growing coalition of more than 80 industry and conservation leaders led by Conservation International and working to make coffee the world's most sustainable commodity.

Bright Sparks Charity Helps Educate Disadvantaged Children

Chiswick based charity Bright Sparks is helping to educate children from the slums of India. The initial spark for Bright Sparks came in 2001 when a group of women working together in the Punjab in the north of India, decided to provide an education for ten local children involved in child labour.

The school is a happy and energetic learning environment for over 100 children, who receive a flexible and supportive education, enabling them to learn at a level which suits them.

The children live with their parents in a slum on the outskirts of Mohali in Punjab, in illegal settlements that could be demolished by the government at any time, and in unsanitary conditions without running water. Often, a whole family shares one room.

Many of the children are involved in child labour, some as young as eight years old working to support their families, and so have fallen through the gaps of the normal schooling process.

Many of the families belong to government recognised 'scheduled castes' - the lowest castes in Hindu society, and are typically rural migrant families from the poorer rural states of India.

The children's parents move to Mohali to seek employment, but being illiterate they work mostly as unskilled workers.

Bright Sparks enables children to spend time with their friends and have space and time away from the harsh environment they live and work in, making the school a very important part of their lives.

Bright Sparks gives the children a potential way out of poverty, an opportunity to learn and progress, earn a higher income when they are old enough and so transform their lives.

The school's staff work closely with the children's families



and support them where possible with difficulties that may stop their children from coming to school. These can include paying for the loss of a child's wage, providing medication, transport costs to hospital and, on occasions, giving food parcels to families.

It recognises that the best way to make long-lasting changes is to work in partnership with local people and services to meet the needs of the children coming to school each day.

£10,000 a year is needed to maintain and run the school.

With continued support the school hopes it will employ more teachers to deliver education and support for older children and increase the capacity of the school further.

A small donation goes a long way. All donations contribute to the running costs and future development of the charity. Even a small amount can make a big change:

£5 a month will enable the school to buy computers and books providing skills that could be the difference between a job with prospects or

a life lived hand-to-mouth. £10 a month will provide an education for a child or young person who will often be the first family member able to read and write.

£25 a month will pay for 80 hours of class tutoring a month.

MP QUESTIONS PRIME MINISTER OVER FAILURE TO TACKLE AIR POLLUTION

MP questions Prime Minister over failure to tackle air pollution after Court rules Government plans are "unlawful" - Ruth Cadbury, MP for Brentford and Isleworth, questioned the Prime Minister, just hours after a court ruling that Government plans to tackle air pollution are "unlawful". Ruth said: "On Monday Children and parents at St Mary's catholic school in Chiswick told me of their concerns about air pollution affecting children's health, this morning the High Court ruled that the Government has comprehensively failed to properly tackle air pollution; which does the Prime Minister feel is worse, the Government losing in the High Court for a third time or the 40,000 early deaths that result from air pollution every year in the UK?"

On Monday 19th February, Ruth visited one of the borough's most polluted schools St Marys Catholic Primary School, Chiswick, to listen to concerns the head teacher,

er, governors and children had about air pollution from the A4 affecting the pupil's health, and their ideas to address the problem.

Ruth spoke to governors, teachers and parents about the action they are exploring such as a green wall along the A4, and air purifiers in classrooms, but what's really needed is Government action not failure.

The charity, Client Earth, successfully won in court with a ruling that current plans to improve air quality are "unlawful" because they do not bring nitrogen dioxide levels within legal limits in the "shortest possible time". This is the third time Client Earth have won rulings against ministers over failures to meet legal limits for the pollutant.

4% Rise In Council Tax For Borough of Hounslow

Ongoing financial pressures as a result of significant reductions in central Government funding have meant that Council Tax in the Borough of Hounslow will increase this year, says Hounslow Council. At a meeting of the Borough Council on Tuesday, 20 February, councillors agreed a four per cent rise for 2018/19. This adds an extra £44.91 for a typical Band D property (excluding the Greater London Authority precept).

Half of this is ringfenced to protect services for the most vulnerable families from further cuts.

Cllr Theo Dennison, Cabinet Member for Finance and Citizen Engagement, Hounslow Council, said:

"Every year the council faces significant cuts in funding from central Government, which forces us to make difficult decisions on where to focus resources.

"We have had to reduce our spending by £27.4m to balance the books in 2018/19, and to minimise the impact on services and residents as much as possible we have



tried to focus on encouraging greater use of online services, reducing contract and insurance costs and making back office staff reductions.

"Grant reductions put our capacity to provide local services under pressure every day. To address the needs of a growing and aging population, and to protect frontline services as best we can, we will need to increase Council Tax this year."

Cllr Steve Curran, Leader of Hounslow Council, said:

"Our ability to provide excellent local services is under more pressure than ever, with continual reductions in our grant income from Government every year since 2010. "Nevertheless, we will continue to invest in the services

and priorities that are important to residents, and to make savings where we can. I am determined to improve services, deliver better value for money and to make our borough a better place for us all to live."



They want the government to listen to them then get on and build this vital new runway."

Labour's increased Council Tax for Southfield contains a blue stain

It is understandable that people don't go to council meetings, however in Ealing Town Hall last week, the Council voted to raise tax by 5.99% The Liberal Democrats voted against the proposal for a number of reasons including:

- The council has failed to forecast budgets accurately in a range of service areas meaning additional over-spends have taken place
- Many of the efficiency saving proposals appeared 'late in the day'
- For many proposals, the savings have not been made and replacement proposals have been required. This has meant that even when the Council Tax debate and meeting took place, some of the details remained hidden from public scrutiny

Liberal Democrats demand that proposals are thought through earlier, so that discussion about the pros and cons can take place. The blue stain in this year's discussion came at the end when the Tory spokesperson said that the Council should have



made about £30 million of cuts in additional to the proposed Council tax. £30 million is such a huge figure at this stage in the day and it would mean that possibly many hundreds of staff would be made redundant, or our streets would not be swept more than a few times a year! Or perhaps the Conservatives would like to put up parking charges by a huge sum. All those scenarios leave me with the judgement that the Labour party should not be running Ealing Council and the

Conservatives should give up, given their lack of judgement on key local issues. One is that Councils up and down the country are suffering from is the increasing cost of providing social care for the greater number of residents who are vulnerable. It is therefore deplorable that the government continues to avoid looking for a funding solution. Until a solution is found, great numbers of people will suffer here in Chiswick and across London.

Quizzing the PM on air pollution

Her reply implied the Government had not in fact lost the case, claiming the Court had

What modest improvements in London air quality have been achieved are through the Mayor of London's action. Sadiq Khan, has introduced cleaner buses on routes through polluted centres such as Chiswick High Road, and has introduced charges to deter heavily polluting vehicles from central London. However, without action by Government, the Mayor has one hand tied behind his back. Through Brentford and Isle-

worth the A4 brings thousands of vehicles in and out of London every day. The Mayor is undertaking 50 'air quality audits' for primary schools in the worst polluted areas in London to help protect children from toxic air in the capital. In my constituency St Marys Catholic School and The William Hogarth Primary School beside the A4 are those being audited.

Air pollution is an invisible slow killer, its stealth is a main reason it remains such a problem. This public health emergency needs action now from a Government that is willing to face up to the problem and put the necessary plans in place to solve it.

Those with asthma, heart conditions, the elderly and children who are still developing their lungs will be most harmed until something is done about this public health crisis.

Governors, teachers and parents of St Marys Catholic School are taking action by looking to install a green wall along the A4 to capture and block harmful NO2 and by installing air purifiers in

their classrooms. However, it should not be up to parents and teachers to do the job of those in Whitehall. What's really needed is Government action, not "unlawful" plans.

HOUNSLOW COUNCIL CLAMPING DOWN ON ILLEGAL NIGHT TIME PARKING



A new taskforce responsible for tackling night time parking violations has begun working across the borough. The parking enforcement team will monitor all areas of the borough, looking out for parking violations to stop increasingly illegal behaviour that takes place in the evening and at night. Vehicle owners who ignore parking rules will be given a fine of up to £110. The new team has been intro-

This new initiative is being trialled for a year and will be reviewed thereafter. Motorists are reminded that parking on double yellow lines is not permitted at any time. Drivers should always check on-street signage to see if parking restrictions apply.

Redesign CS9 Responds To Pollution Questions Regarding CS9

Redesign CS9, a self-funded group of local group of traders and residents who live and work in Hammersmith and Chiswick, has clarified its position on pollution questions with regards to the proposed CS9 Cycle Super Highway. They have argued that the CS9 plans as they stand would lead to congestion and pollution elsewhere in Chiswick, pushing vehicles onto roads less able to carry large volumes of traffic. The campaign said "There are many other initiatives that could reduce pollution in the

area including implementing the Ultra Low Emission zone. Whilst motor traffic is a major cause of air pollution, significant amounts of pollution are caused also by other factors including, in winter, by wood burning stoves." Indeed, a recent study by King's College London found that in January 2018, wood-burning stoves produced 50% of the toxic emissions in some areas of London. Another recent study published in Science magazine found that volatile chemicals emitted by household clean-

ers and cosmetics react with air to produce significant causes of secondary pollution by photochemical smog. The campaign also spoke about the costs of CS9 to bus passengers, and the population of Chiswick unable to cycle, citing figures that show Chiswick's higher proportion of elderly residents in comparison to the rest of Hounslow borough.

23 ARRESTS IN WEST LONDON DRUGS RAIDS

HOUNSLOW MAN JAILED FOR RUNNING BROTHEL

A man has been jailed for 11 months for running a brothel in Hounslow.

Ionut-Daniel Bosoi, 29 (28.08.88) of no fixed abode was sentenced at Isleworth Crown Court on Thursday, 15 February following a four-day trial.

The court heard how on 29 August, 2017, officers attended an address on Spring Grove Road in Hounslow, following reports that it was operating as a brothel.

On arrival, Bosoi answered the door to officers and let them in, stating he had friends inside. It was soon identified that Bosoi was making money from sexually exploiting three women.

Bosoi was arrested at the address on suspicion of managing a brothel.

During a search of the property, officers identified price lists and cash hidden under mattresses.

Bosoi was charged the following day and appeared at Uxbridge Magistrates' Court on 30 August 2017 where he

pleaded not guilty.

The investigation formed part of the Met's Operation Pathway - an initiative in Hounslow involving police, specialist charities and the local authority, to help individuals find a safe way out of the sex trade. The lead investigating officer, PC Imran Malik, said "After coming to the UK from Romania in early 2017, Bosoi sought to make money by exploiting young women. "The Mets take a hard line on sexual exploitation and this type of organised crime will be dealt with robustly."

HELPING STUDENTS NAVIGATE THE STRESS OF MODERN LIFE

Measuring a college's success is a difficult and illusive task and one of the most important components, that of student welfare, is particularly difficult to gauge accurately. That's why a significant amount of time, thought and reflection is applied to students' welfare at the International School of London's Diploma College. This focus on student welfare has a number of moral and educational justifications.

"The incessant rise of stress related illnesses and conditions, particularly amongst teenagers, strongly suggests that societal pressures have increased and that a robust understanding of how to cope with stress should be considered a necessity," says Daniel Spinks, Head of Student Welfare at the ISL Diploma College.

Emotional stability and equilibrium also provide the foundation for learning. Although the stress hormone cortisol serves an important and, at times, useful purpose, elevated levels can have a negative effect on our pre-frontal cortex, our 'thinking brain';

generally, the more stressed we are the less able we are to think clearly, to access memories or to learn.

One of the approaches applied at ISL is a highly appreciated tutor programme, providing a space for students to reflect on a range of topics, many of which explore metacognition, or thinking about how we think.

A key purpose of this approach is to support students to successfully navigate the demands and stresses that seem to have become an expected, yet unwanted, part of modern life. Employing some of the principles of Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, students explore how the way we think about our experiences can influence how we feel, which can then influence how we behave.

Students also consider, amongst many other topics, how to cope with and address failure, fixed vs growth mind sets, what it means to be a "3rd Culture Kid" and positive relationships.

Students also meet their tutor regularly for one-to-one meetings to discuss and ex-

plore their progress, concerns and general experience at the college and, if necessary, outside the college; all concerns are treated seriously and addressed in a sensitive, collegial and inclusive manner.

Another important ingredient in fostering students' welfare is to ensure they have a genuine say in how the college functions. The Student Council has introduced a number of changes to the college in recent weeks, including the replacement of vending machines with a healthier (and cheaper) student-run snack bar and changing the disposable coffee cups with bamboo re-usable cups.

A TV has also been installed into the common room to allow students to keep up to date with current affairs and two punch bags for the new boxing/fitness club that has steadily grown in popularity in recent weeks are due to be installed.

"The student council makes ISL great because it allows students to have a voice and to make choices in how the school can improve in environmental, social and edu-



catational aspects. Having a student government allows the student to make these choices, take initiative, work independently and further our learning about life skills and future possibilities," says Barbara, one of the students at the College.

As any parent of a teenager

will know, nurturing and guiding teenagers rarely occurs without bumps in the road or challenges to overcome but the school is confident that even a brief visit to the college would reveal a vibrant, rich and rewarding learning environment.

Hounslow Parks, Allotments And Cemeteries Now Managed By The Council

From 1st March management of the borough's parks, allotments and cemeteries has been transferred from Carillion to GreenSpace 360, a new subsidiary of the council-owned trading company Lampton 360.

As part of the transfer, the Carillion staff responsible for managing these services will now be employed by GreenSpace 360 and four staff members will be employed by Hounslow Council. Hounslow Council showed its commitment to Carillion staff and to ensuring public services continued by meeting administrators' demands to pay Carillion weekly fees after it emerged that staff would not be paid in February unless the Council made the additional payment. This follows advance payments made by the Council to Carillion for services in January and February as part of the Settlement Agreement.

Councillor Steve Curran, Leader of Hounslow Council said: "Today we offer a warm wel-



come to staff from Carillion following a period of uncertainty. We're proud to be able to offer jobs to staff affected by Carillion's involuntary liquidation and I'd like to praise all those who have worked hard to bring into effect the accelerated and seamless transfer of services to GreenSpace 360.

Following Carillion's announcement we have done everything in our power to reassure staff affected and bring the transfer forward as quickly as possible. Our priorities continue to be continuity of services for our residents and making sure former Carillion

staff are treated fairly." Before Carillion went into involuntary liquidation the Council had already agreed to terminate the Parks contract early with a transfer date of 9 April set. Due to the events that unfolded, this transfer was brought forward.

End the Breast Cancer Treatment Postcode lottery

To the Editor,

I was alarmed to read a new report by the All Party Parliamentary Group on Breast Cancer, A Mixed Picture, which uncovered stark contrasts in the diagnosis, treatment and care of breast cancer patients across England.

This variation is unacceptable. Depending on where they live in England, some women are more than twice as likely to die from breast cancer under the age of 75.

In our own area, the Greater London region, there is significant variation in premature mortality rates between different Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs). For example in Tower Hamlets CCG on average 13.3 women under the age of 75 per 100,000 die from breast cancer, but in Westminster CCG it is 26.3 – almost twice as many and well above the national average.

Access to the best breast cancer services shouldn't be dictated by where you live, so that's why I have joined a new campaign by the charity Breast Cancer Now to end this postcode lottery.

I have emailed my local MP asking them to urgently contact our local Cancer Alliance to discuss how these issues can be addressed, to ensure that women throughout England receive the best possible treatment and care no matter where they live. Ruth Cadbury MP Backs Call For Legal Aid To Be Restored For Early Advice



Ruth Cadbury has today backed the Law Society's campaign calling for the Government to provide legal aid for early advice in family and housing law.

Since 2012, legal aid has not been available for most areas of early legal advice. A lack of free early legal advice can cause problems to escalate unnecessarily, adding more pressure on public services, potentially increasing the burden on the courts, and increasing the cost to the public purse. The lack of legal aid for early advice is a barrier to individuals accessing justice, which has a wider impact on

the rule of law and the ability of individuals to access their rights.

Speaking after a Parliamentary event on the campaign, Ruth Cadbury said:

"I am regularly contacted by constituents with issues which could have been resolved sooner if only they had access to free early legal advice. We know the Government is currently reviewing the legal aid reforms made in 2012, and as part of that review I urge them to consider providing legal aid for early advice and without huge cost and anxiety to them over many months." Law Society president, Joe

Egan, said:

"A lack of free early legal advice can cause problems to escalate unnecessarily, potentially increasing the burden on the courts and increasing costs to the taxpayer. The current system is a false economy, meaning more cases are ending up in court that could have been resolved earlier, and more pressure is applied on our already stretched public services. We are calling on the Government to provide legal aid for early advice as part of their review of legal aid reforms."

On the couch with Nicholas Rose Mental Health Round Up



Make sure depression does not destroy your relationship. In my work with couples it often comes to light, that at some point in the past, one of the couple has struggled with depression. Through therapy couples often come to realise that the way they responded at the time harmed their relationship. In this article I explain what often happens and what to do.

Depression often occurs after something has happened in a person's life that has been difficult to cope with. The struggle can be very tiring, resulting in low confidence and a circle of behaviour that only serves to lead to more unhappiness.

It can have a terrible impact on how someone experiences their life on a day to day basis, symptoms often include a felt sense of low desire to undertake daily activities including work, socialising, exercise etc. It can have a debilitating effect and often be a very confusing experience for the sufferer and their friends and relatives. It can also have a significant impact upon partners and can often lead to the breakdown of relationships.

So what goes wrong? In our relationships we generally expect that partners support each other during difficult times and illness. So far so good! However the difficulty



tends to come from failing to support partners in a way that recognises the needs of a healthy relationship.

All too often, the person struggling will most likely be experienced by their partner as withdrawing and this creates a dilemma. On the one hand the partner will be upset to see the person they care about struggling and want to help them, whilst at the same time they are also likely to be struggling themselves with negative feelings about how the relationship with their partner has changed.

To be upset ourselves when our partners are struggling can be difficult as judging thoughts can come to mind like indulgent, selfish, uncaring. We prefer to think that when things go wrong for someone we care about we will drop everything and put the other person first and that they will do the same for us. Whilst this expresses just how important our partners are for

us it introduces a mindset that leads to thinking about "them and me" and not about "us". So at a time when we both most need our relationship to be working well we tend to put it on hold, relegate it, not give it priority.

Quite simply if you are affected by the fact your partner is struggling then you need to look at it as information telling you that your relationship is struggling. If someone is unhappy in a relationship then it is an unhappy relationship and no matter how tempting it is to try and hide this fact from a partner who is struggling, ultimately that partner will not thank you for this further down the line. So what is it that happens that causes the relationship harm? Usually the partner not struggling puts their needs to one side, they might miss their "old partner", but they give them space, or their sex life but don't want to impose, or being able to talk about their own problems. Unfortunately

mind them! Unfortunately patterns get put in place whereby the supporting partner also withdraws and changes their behaviour with the result the way the relationship works is changed to such an extent that a time comes when neither recognise it any more. The relationship can be experienced as lifeless, dead, lonely. Couples can often avoid this for years, particularly if they have children, busy jobs, other interests etc but ultimately they become to realise that their relationship is no longer there for them.

Main points - Think about your relationship - it is not helpful to think just about your partner and yourself separately. Take a step back and think together about what you can do so that you can both feel as though you remain committed to each other. Even if your relationship is in

a good place at the moment talk about this now - if trouble comes along you will have an agreed strategy in place and this will make it much easier to have the conversations that will help.

If you or your partner is depressed share this article with them and think about seeking couples / relationship / marriage counselling.

Old Charms, New Feels In The Palm Beaches

Transportation

Brightline - Palm Beach, Fla.

Now 124 years later, holiday goers can retrace Flagler's Florida trail through the exciting development of Brightline, an express intercity railway service between West Palm Beach, Fort Lauderdale and Miami. Much like Flagler's East Coast railway, Brightline forges a connection between the bustling towns and cities, linking West Palm Beach to Fort Lauderdale in 30 minutes and to Miami in just 60 minutes. Phase Two of Brightline is expected to connect West Palm Beach directly to the Orlando International Airport in just two hours.

Hotels

The Colony Hotel - Palm Beach, Fla.

This ultra-posh paradise of a boutique hotel offers Instagram-worthy décor, beachside yoga, a new art gallery space by Voltz Clarke, and much more. The 1947 landmark delights with its classic British Colonial architecture and 89 stunning rooms, suites, villas and penthouses. Many of Hollywood's elite have spent time at the time-



less property, including Frank Sinatra, Judy Garland, and John Lennon. It is also just steps away from the picturesque shopping district of Worth Avenue and Midtown Beach.

The Breakers - Palm Beach, Fla.

A treasured palace of the past, with modern day ap-

peal, this iconic resort dates to the 1890s when founder Henry Morrison Flagler set out to build a grand property on the shores of Palm Beach Island. Today, the Italian-inspired resort destination annually invests more than \$30 million to both preserve and enhance the property, balancing its classic charm with

contemporary luxuries. The Breakers' 140 acres features four pools, a collection of 25 poolside bungalows, 36 holes of championship golf, on-site watersports, 12 shopping boutiques, a 6,000-square-foot oceanfront fitness facility, an indoor/outdoor spa, and even a luxury boutique hotel within the hotel - Flagler



Club.

Attractions

Silverball Museum & Arcade - Delray Beach, Fla.

Ranging from 1950s to 2016, this museum arcade offers more than 200 rotating vintage pinball machines and video games for play. Currently the museum houses 80 pinball machines from the 50s to current, 24 video games, and many others including air-hockey, and shuffleboard. Each machine also displays a placard with the origin, the year in which it was created, and the original quantity created.


Wick Theatre & Costume Museum - Boca Raton, Fla.



Conmen are also targeting businesses. According to a Financial Times report in January, Cyber attacks have pushed corporate fraud around the world to an all-time high, with information theft overtaking the appropri-

ation of physical assets for the first time on record, according to new data.

One scam used is to trick businesses into sending supply payments to a fictitious bank account set up by conmen posing as suppliers. The con comes to light when the true supplier chases up late payment. Other conmen pose as software engineers calling to rectify fictitious network faults. Disclosing computer pin numbers and other access details enable the fraudsters to download data including bank details and personal information. Yet others pose as police men demanding information.

Often scams are Ponzi schemes, where fraudsters take the latest patsy's money to pay money to the previous chump, plus themselves

of course. The conman continues to rake in money for himself as long there are people and businesses who think more of a high return and profits than they do of the risk of losing their own or their company's money. If even the most basic of checks are not possible before investing, for example, because the investment is located overseas or the conman is stalling, then the investor should just say no.

Businesses should make cyber security a board-level matter as important as making profits and directors should familiarise themselves with best practice and regulations, including the UK data protection act and EU directives on data protection and cyber security. Basic controls such as malware and keeping it up

to date, firewalls, passwords, staff training, never revealing passwords, bank details, or PIN numbers, staff segregation, setting company-wide cyber security policies and regularly monitoring compliance, can significantly improve cyber security.

The UK government published its Digital Charter in January and, according to the government: "sets the direction for the UK to become the best place to start and grow a digital business and the safest place in the world to be online".

The UK government's Digital, Culture, Media and Sports Secretary of State, Matt Hancock said:

"The internet is a powerful force for good with the potential to benefit everyone's lives. Not only does it make it easier



to shop or check the weather, but it also underpins revolutionary technologies which allow new robotics to make difficult medical procedures easier.

But there are clear challenges and we need to protect people from the potential harms. Our Digital Charter responds to this challenge and through it we will agree new standards for online behaviour to make

sure the UK continues to be an innovation friendly digital economy and haven for tech investment."

The Digital Charter will follow key principles, such as ensuring the internet remains free, open and accessible, that personal data should be respected and used appropriately, and the rights people have offline should be protected online.

IS INVOICE FINANCE RIGHT FOR YOU?

Dr P Singh finds out

We have seen with the liquidation of Carillion that cash is vital for a business's survival. At times, banks and conventional lenders can make funding too costly or just turn off the tap. So where can a company turn to for essential cash in a hurry? To its debtors, specifically its customer invoices (aka its receivables). Some big companies, such as Carillion, have been known to take up to 120 days to pay their invoices. That's far too long for many small cash-strapped companies to wait, so they could try to sell those invoices, a process generally known as invoice finance (which includes variations known as: factoring and invoice discounting).

Factoring companies, such as banks, provide cash to invoice sellers then collect the invoice amount off the debtor on its due date. This service is therefore equivalent to a loan so 'interest' is charged.

Many banks offering invoice finance insist that a company sells all its invoices regularly to them, even at times when cash is not needed.

Cash for Invoices Limited (CFIL) of Chiswick however lets a company sell single invoices only when cash is needed by the company, so there are no regular fees to pay. Its single invoice finance service is therefore 'pay-as-you-go'.

Whereas banks charge a raft of fees plus interest (for administration, credit protection, arranging a facility, renewal, etc), CFIL charges just one fee, and that includes full credit protection so there is no recourse to the seller if the debtor defaults (some banks might just hand back invoices in default to the selling company).

Banks only offer invoice finance if the annual turnover of the selling company is above a minimum; for example, £500,000 (HSBC) and £50,000 (Lloyds). Such large minimum turnovers therefore shut out many small businesses.

CFIL has no minimum turnover, and can buy single invoices from as little as £250 and up to £50,000. It also does not insist on a seller's guar-

antee or other security. The invoice debtor will, however, be asked to confirm the validity of the invoice, i.e., CFIL's service is disclosed invoice finance. Some banks might offer confidential invoice finance if the company does not want their customer to be aware their invoice has been sold.

One reason some companies prefer confidentiality is it avoids the negative signal to a debtor that the seller must be in financial trouble. This can be true in some situations. In other situations, invoice finance can be a positive signal - that a company is managing its cash efficiently by releasing the cash tied up in its invoices, which it can reinvest to grow its business.

Before making a decision on whether invoice finance is right for your business, a cost-benefit analysis should be undertaken, and it's always a good idea to shop around, understand all the fees and costs payable, and other terms and conditions.

Bees suffer narrow defeat at Leeds

On Saturday, Brentford travelled to Elland Road to face a Leeds side who were winless in their last ten fixtures. The Bees on the other hand, were in fine form having back to back victories in their last two matches, most recently their 5-0 thrashing against Birmingham.

The visitors were on the front foot in the opening stages of the game and came close to opening the scoring after twelve minutes. Woods lofted his free-kick on the half-way line into the centre of the Leeds box. Although the hopeful punt was met by an unchallenged, headed clearance, it only reached as far as Egan from 25 yards. The centre-back decided to fire the shot on the half-volley and it was a spectacular effort which flew towards the top corner. However, it was just about matched by Wiedwald, his cat-like reflexes and acrobatic dive allowed him to tip the ball over the bar.

Despite Brentford's continued dominance, they were unable

to find a breakthrough goal. Just after the half hour mark, Leeds took the lead against the run of play. The hosts were able to win a free-kick on the left-wing following a quick counter attack. Aloski swung the ball in towards the first post, and it was the towering Cooper who latched onto the cross. The defender was able to flick the ball across goal, and his attempt crept into the bottom corner to give his side a narrow lead.

The home side went into the break with their lead intact as it seemed as if the goal had upset Brentford's rhythm of play and it was now Leeds who were on the front foot.

This was shown in the 62nd minute when the hosts came incredibly close to doubling their lead. Leeds midfielder Saiz was able to release Lasogga down the right wing with a perfectly weighted through ball. The forward was confronted by Egan on the edge of the box, but he beat the defender with ease as his dummied shot left Egan in a

heap on the floor. Bees keeper Bentley then decided to come flying off his line, and once again Lasogga was able to deceive him with some tricky footwork. Despite this amazing solo run, his finish was underwhelming, just about allowing Woods to clear the attempt off the line and keep his side in the game.

Brentford came close to rescuing a point in the 89th minute after substitute Marcondes was able to win a free-kick just outside the opposition area. It was Judge who stood over the set-piece and the Irishman struck the ball powerfully towards the centre of the goal. Wiedwald could only parry the attempt back into the centre of the box towards Jozefzoon, but the winger was unable to sort his feet out in time. Instead the ball reached Canos on the edge of the box, but the Spaniard could only blaze the ball high and wide, allowing Leeds' first victory since Boxing Day.

This 1-0 loss means the Bees



are in tenth, and now four points away from the play-off positions. Brentford boss Dean Smith was frustrated with the officials as he stated "It looked like it was going to be one way traffic, but then the Leeds goal comes from an offside position." He continued to reveal his displeasure

by emphasising "We should have had a penalty when Neal Maupay gets thrown to the ground. You want the big decisions to go your way, but they didn't today." However, the Bees boss also found fault with his side for their loss since they "Were too sloppy on the ball and the subs didn't

work today. We were very poor on the ball, certainly in the second half."

Dean Smith will definitely find the time to ensure this doesn't happen again having signed a one-year extension on his contract on Thursday.

Fulham Dominate League Leaders

Fulham were able to win a crucial three points in their late push for promotion on Saturday evening when Wolves visited Craven Cottage. The clash was set up for a tight affair with both sides having been in great form recently, Wolves were undefeated in their last five, whereas Fulham had not lost in their previous twelve league fixtures.

The hosts came incredibly close to opening the scoring just thirteen minutes into the match through Newcastle loanee Mitrovic. The Serbian was first to pounce onto Cairney's deflected shot, and despite the ball bouncing away from goal, he was still able to chip it over the head of Ruddy. However, Coady was able to get back in time to make a superb clearance of his own line to prevent a definite goal.

Fulham continued to be on the front foot in the first half, and their dominance eventually paid off with the first goal of the evening in the 38th minute. Johansen was able to latch onto a poor, scuffed clearance on edge of the box,



then slide the ball through to Mitrovic. The forward immediately fired the ball across goal towards the bottom corner, although Ruddy was able to get a palm to the stinging shot, he could only parry it towards the edge of the six yard box. It was Sessegnon who was first to react and simply fire the ball into the back of the net for the youngsters 13th goal of the season.

Cavaleiro was able to force two awkward saves out of Bettinelli before the Cottagers

sealed the victory with a second goal. Mitrovic received the ball at his feet thirty yards from goal and was able to use his strength to power past the defender marking him and stride towards the box. Once he reached the edge of the box, the Serb unleashed a stinging shot which flew into the bottom corner. The final score was 2-0 consolidating the West London side's position in the play-offs and extending their league unbeaten streak to thirteen games.

Last Friday, Brentford head coach Dean Smith signed a one-year extension to his contract with the Championship club, along with his assistants. Smith, aged 46, Richard O'Kelly and Thomas Frank are now set to remain at the West London side until the end of the 2019-20 season. Smith took charge at Griffin Park in November 2015 following a move from Walsall in which O'Kelly also moved alongside him. Frank however, joined the coaching team

in December 2016 and is the ex-manager of Danish club Brondby.

Despite a dreadful start to the season with just one win in the Bees' first eleven league games. Smith and his coaching staff have been able to turn their season around and are now sitting in tenth position, just five points from the play-off positions.

"It's really pleasing," Smith exclaimed. "It didn't take us too long to sort it all out to be honest. I'm happy the club

wanted to extend it and we are happy to stay as well."

The Bees' co-director of football, Rasmus Ankersen, added "We have been pleased to see the progress the team had made this season." He continued "We strongly believe that we are on the right path, and with the new contracts for Dean, Richard and Thomas, we can now continue the hard work with stability in key coaching positions."
